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CARE OF SCHOOL DEVICE

Cleaning

It is important to clean technology devices especially if the school device is shared with multiple students. Only use designated screen cleaners with a soft cloth such as a microfiber cloth. Do not use window cleaner, water, or any other liquid on any technology device. Always spray the cloth with the cleaner, and not the device itself.

EMAIL for students

Student email

- Grade 6-8 students are only allowed to exchange email with others within the WSCS Gmail domain (fellow students, teachers, and staff members.)
- Grade 4-5 students
- Grade Kdg-3 who are given email privileges during extended periods of time when face-to-face learning is not possible, are only allowed to send and receive emails from their teacher. Teachers will be able to communicate via email with the student, and students will be able to email their teacher.

Although Google Chat is turned off for students, some students have turned to Google Docs to communicate.
Guidelines	<p>Here are some guidelines for students to follow when communicating through Google Docs:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Keep the document to a maximum of five people - more than that can be difficult to manage. 2. Keep conversation to just the people on that document. No one else should be discussed or talked about that are not present in the conversation. 3. The document must be shared with the students' teacher(s). At any given time, the teachers can log on, and view the conversation. 4. Any violation of these rules will be discussed and may result in a loss of the privilege. 5. Remember, the wonderful things learned so far through Protect Young Eyes. Technology is awesome when used wisely.
